



## Comprehensive Eye Health Evaluation Consent Form

Comprehensive Eye Health Evaluations include a refraction needed for a personalized spectacle or contact lens prescription, dilation to inspect the retina for disease, and a retinal screening to have a record of your retinal health.

Check to **DECLINE** or if you do not want these services, otherwise they will be performed to give you a personalized and complete record.

- Dilation**: Needed to get a more complete view of the retina. The retina is the most important part of the eye. Vision loss caused by retinal disease is permanent. Most blindness in the United States comes from retinal disease. Retinal disease includes but not limited to: Tumors, macular degeneration, glaucoma, retinal holes or detachments, and systemic diseases such as diabetes, stroke, and high blood pressure.

**Included in the routine eye health evaluation.**

- Retinal Screening**: Needed to complete your record of your retinal health. It is used in comparing future retinal findings. The retinal camera does not require dilation in most cases. It does not replace dilation, but can be used to evaluate the retina when dilation is not required.

Insurance does not typically cover any advanced screening technology beyond the general eye exam unless previously diagnosed. The screening can be performed for:
